# August 2016

Hello Church Family!

Jesus told us to "make disciples" by leading them to repentance and baptism, and "teaching them to obey everything" that He commanded (Matt 28:19-20). Obeying "everything" Jesus taught is a tough commandment! Even though it's tough, it's imperative to obey what our Lord has commanded. Obeying everything Jesus taught is much more manageable when I remember a few things:

First, even Jesus "increased" or "grew" over time (Luke 2:52). If Jesus "increased" in wisdom and stature over time, then surely it'll take some time for me to grow into the image of Christ (Rom. 8:29). If Jesus can learn things in His life (e.g., Heb. 5:8), then it means I shouldn't expect to be where I want to be overnight.

Second, acting and thinking like Jesus is a process of growth. We move from acting less like Jesus to acting more like Jesus. We move from thinking like the world to thinking more like Jesus. This is assumed throughout Paul's letters. Paul knew that our faith is supposed to grow (e.g., 2 Cor. 10:15; Eph. 4:15-16). Paul says it articulately to the churches in Asia Minor:



"I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you spiritual wisdom and revelation in your growing knowledge of him, –since the eyes of your heart have been enlightened–so that you may know what is the hope of his calling, what is the wealth of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the incomparable greatness of his power toward us who believe, as displayed in the exercise of his immense strength" (Eph. 1:17-19 NET).

Moreover, Peter prays that his congregations "grow in the rich knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord!" (2 Pet. 1:2) and encourages them to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Pet. 3:18 NET).

Third, *God is right in the midst of our growth*. Paul stated explicitly that it is "God who causes the growth." (1 Cor. 3:7 NET) To the Christians at Colossae, Paul prays that God will "fill you with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, ..." (Col. 1:9-12 NET).

Finally, we can prohibit our growth. It's our fault. Paul was upset with the Christians at Corinth because they were "infants in Christ," or "people of the flesh" (1 Cor. 1:3). When he was in their churches, Paul couldn't teach them what he wanted because they were still acting like pagans, driven by dissension and jealousy. Paul told them, "I fed you milk, not solid food, for you were not yet ready. In fact, you are still not ready, for you are still influenced by the flesh. For since there is still jealousy and dissension among you, are you not influenced by the flesh and behaving like unregenerate people?" (1 Cor. 3:2-3 NET) The author of Hebrews makes a very similar complaint to his church(es): "For though you should in fact be teachers by this time, you need someone to teach you the beginning elements of God's utterances. You have gone back to needing milk, not solid food. For everyone who lives on milk is inexperienced in the message of righteousness, because he is an infant. But solid food is for the mature, whose perceptions are trained by practice to discern both good and evil" (Heb. 5:12-14 NET). What would these authors say about you? Should you be farther along than you are? If so, why are you still an infant?

How is your growth coming? Do you speak to people like Jesus? Do you think like Jesus? Do you treat every person, even your enemies, like Jesus? Is your demeanor like Jesus? Are your values like Jesus? If you're not where you want to be, don't be discouraged. Don't give up!

At FCC, there are numerous ways to help you grow. We emphasize the need to WORSHIP God as a community and in our personal lives; GROW in our faith as we gather in growth groups and practice personal disciplines to help us connect deeply with God; CARE for one another so that no one has need; and SERVE those who consider FCC home through our ministries, as well as serve those beyond the walls of the church through local and global ministries.

It has been an amazing month here for FCC Youth! So many things happened. Youth went to Kansas City for almost a week to work with compassion ministries such as the Harvesters, City Union Mission, and the Upper Room. Our students had an amazing time working in Kansas City. We packed food packages for the homeless and had kids, who were learning how to read through the Upper Room, read to us. Those kids noticed that some of our students had white arm hairs and started calling them polar bear for the rest of the week. It was pretty funny. Overall, God was moving in and through us during this trip. The trip brought the students together and impacted many kids who would otherwise be neglected. Our students committed to a life of Scripture and service.

### MISSIONS NEWS FROM SWANSON FAMILY

### Hi Everyone!

We are still here in Mexico plugging away at our various responsibilities. This summer we find ourselves without children while Ryan spends the summer at a camp in Montana. Thank you to those who are praying for him this summer.

The teachers' union continues to block roads entering in and out of Oaxaca. This has affected us and those we serve in minor ways so far. We are glad that even though tensions run high, there have not been any significant confrontations recently since the original report we sent out a few weeks ago.

In some of the international stores, like this Sam's Club, there has been evidence that trucks carrying supplies have been kept out of Oaxaca. But on the same day, this national store was fully stocked. Two weeks later, Sam's Club was back up and fully stocked. So it all depends on whether or not trucks are allowed to pass by the blockaders. The blockades have also affected workshop attendance. Only 2 students made the trip to the current Literacy Principles workshop.

A few weeks ago, only about one third of about 18 students were able to travel to the Biblical Key Terms workshop. However, another workshop, called the "Diplomado," is currently happening in another state outside of Oaxaca. We are happy to report that 60 students are attending this workshop. The Diplomado lasts a full month and covers many aspects of both translation and literacy.

### We praise the Lord for...

- · A place to stay with Ed's mother while in the U.S. She is also generously allowing us to use her car while we are there. Megan has the same benefits for most of her time in the U.S.
- · A great group of people who have invested with us in this ministry in Mexico. (Pray for God to use the video to raise up more missionary workers.)
- 98% of our support quota has been met these past 12 months; even with the blockades, we are not lacking.
- Our car fund continues to grow. We have received some special gifts and have been able to set aside a
  portion of these gifts towards our car savings. Currently we have \$3350 in savings!

### Pray for...

- · Affordable seats to occupy as we fly standby. Ryan will be joining us on the return trip.
- · Megan to be able to return to Asia fully supported with the same benefits we experience: people that also pray for and encourage her.
- · Rachel. Melissa hopes to go a little early to spend a few days with Rachel in Virginia. She misses her family.
- · Ryan, to grow in his relationship with the Lord and influence others to follow Him.
- Paul. Working 12-14 hour night shifts is, well, work. Pray he can get past this first year and still manage to have a life outside of work. He also has several annoying health issues. Pray for healing.
- · Wisdom for Ed and the security team as the continue to monitor things here in Oaxaca.
- Peace in Oaxaca between the government, police and teachers.
